In this six-month program, you will learn to prepare meals, help patients follow a proper diet, dispense medications, and assist patients with bathing, dressing and grooming. Caregivers may also perform



housekeeping duties, escort patients to appointments, engage patients in recreational activities, and run errands. Caregivers may work in private homes or an assisted living facility.

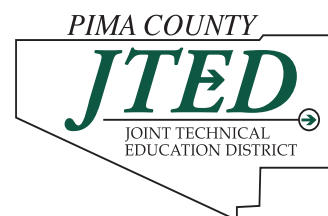
